Hello fellow club members and all that receive this newsletter. It's the time of the year when I try to summarize everything that we have done and accomplished at W3PIE. It was a very busy year and a lot of things have taken place so what I decided to do was to list the events and accomplishments rather than try to summarize them in paragraph form.

- 1. The Newsletter has been reincarnated and Cory (WA3UVV) has done an excellent job in putting this together. Each month he brings us up to date with the goings on at the club along with very useful information for all of the members.
- 2. January 29th & 30th Winter Field Day took place at the club and it was very successful. We had a total of 16 operators that took part.
- 3. One of the landmark events was the installation of the High Speed Internet at the club. This opened up a whole new world to us allowing us to move forward with Echolink, Zoom meetings and special events at the club as well as in the EOC center, Wires X system fusion on two of our repeaters and a multitude of other things that we were never able to do at the club before. A great big thank you to Mark (K3PPP) for following through with this and making it all possible.
- 4. In addition to the W3PIE information and traffic net that we have every Thursday evening at 9:00pm on the 147.045 repeater we also have the Keystone Wide Net, which is a digital net on Sunday evening a 8:00pm. This net takes place on the 443.750 club repeater and since it is a Fusion Digital Net the room number is 60328. The 147.255 repeater is also a digital repeater now and is open for everyone that wishes to access the Fusion Wires X digital world.
- 5. We purchased two brand new Yaesu FTDX 10 HF radios for use at the club as well as when we do POTA events or the field day events.
- 6. Speaking of POTA events we held three POTA events this year:
- A Saturday April 23rd at Game Lands #51 behind Jumonville Cross.
- B The third weekend of May at Braddock's Grave.
- C September 3rd at the Pa State Game Land 138

7. The Emergency Operation Center (EOC) has been completely re-done and we are all set up with Generator and Battery back up should the need occur.

The EOC held a simulated drill on the 1st of October, which was our first simulation, and for the most part it went quit well considering it was our first simulation.

We had a 911 SIMULATED emergency activation on April 20th that went very well. We had 15 participants on the 147.045 repeater, which was a good turnout for our organization. This test was coordinated through the Fayette 911 organization. As I said this was only a SIMULATED emergency weather net. Jim(KC3BHN) has been coordinating everything at the EOC and we certainly appreciate his efforts in the work that has been done and is going on there.

- 8. On August 23rd we had a balloon launch at the club grounds. This was a very interesting endeavor because the balloon went around the world and we were able to track it on APRS. It finally took up residence in Las Vegas never to be heard from again.
- 9. With the help of Cory (WA3UVV) W3PIE received a very prestigious award for being associated with the ARRL for 90 years. This is an award that we should all be proud of because there aren't many clubs that have had an affiliation for that period of time.
- 10. Summer Field Day was held on June 25th & 26th. Thanks to Pierre (KA2QPG) for heading up this event. This was another record breaking event for the club surpassing the number of contacts that were made in previous years.
- 11. We held the 72nd Annual Gabfest on August 13th which was a Hugh success. We exceeded all previous recorders with regards to the profit made at the hamfest. The ticket sales, kitchen sales and attendance were all up. This was an amazing Hamfest for W3PIE and the weather cooperated just perfectly. A BIG Thank you to all of you that had anything to do with this event. I don't want to start naming names but all of the members really chipped in to make this the event that it was.

On this Wednesday many of our very knowledgeable club members put together a short synopsis of what ever the members might be interested in.
